THE CHURCHILL CENTER - 2010 SUMMER SESSION

COURSES: 8:30 a.m. – 12:00 p.m.

Students in this program will take three, 1-hour classes each morning from among the following choices. There is a 15-minute break between classes.

ACADEMIC STRATEGIES FOR PEAK PERFORMANCE

Study skills are important lifelong skills. The Churchill School and Center Study Skills Toolkit includes effective strategies for notetaking, organization, managing time and pre- and post-textbook reading.

WRITING ACROSS THE CONTENT AREAS

Effective writing enables students to clearly communicate their understanding of concepts, and it is fundamental to academic success. Students will enhance their expository writing skills by developing new strategies for brainstorming, organizing, drafting, editing, and revising their writing. The course will include explicit instruction in the skills necessary to write a research paper.

READING COMPREHENSION STRATEGY INSTRUCTION

Reading is about understanding and processing: therefore, without comprehension, real reading does not occur. Students will build skills in higher order literacy across content areas. They will learn strategies for linking prior knowledge and making meaningful connections to narrative and expository text which will result in improved synthesis and interpretation of text.

SAT I – PREP FOR MATH

This math course reviews the four mathematics content areas on the SAT I for Math: number and operations; algebra and functions; geometry and measurement; data analysis, statistics and probability. Students will also learn the critical thinking skills and test taking strategies that are necessary to score well. The instructor will provide guided practice in using the calculator to arrive at correct answers and will help students become familiar with student-generated response type questions.
